The date for the rerun is Dec 20th and for it to count he needs to do all six (3 highest peaks 3 highest lakes) in 48hrs

31 Go Mad in Egypt

At 5.45 am on a cold October morning 31 of us gathered in front of our charabanc bound for Gatwick and on to the Red Sea diving adventure for 2008. Many of us mindful of the weight allowance wearing the clothes that we were taking, others wearing clothes more suitable for the beach – all of us warmed by the usual intensity of Roger's shirt.

Check-in proved as entertaining as ever: 31 people, 10 families + 5 tonnes of gear and a sprinkling of teenagers = CHAOS..... Order was quickly restored and very soon we were all aboard one of Monarch's finest aircraft enjoying the delights of a calming G & T after a tiring game of musical chairs. Little did we know that this was not to be our most entertaining check-in of the day.....

On arrival at Sharm El Sheik we boarded our transfer bus all eagerly awaiting the first view of the Creative Grand Resort. Check-in proved as entertaining as ever: 31 tired people, 10 tired families + 10 tonnes of gear (it felt heavier now), a sprinkling of teenagers and the Egyptian set of Fawltly Towers = ENTERTAINMENT – you couldn't make it up! All of Roger's careful planning had been randomly scrambled as Sue (yes, the one I'm married to..) was sharing a room with Mark (yes, the one Ann is married to..). Eventually we were all allocated a room – some had light bulbs, some had sheets but few people could claim to have everything included. Comforted that at least we had somewhere to rest our by now weary heads it was time to head to the restaurant for some food and a well earned beverage. As we were soon to discover in the Creative Grand Resort a group of 31 scurrilous English people had got there before us and apparently taken the only glasses in the hotel. Those who were lucky enough to find a glass quickly had the smile wiped from their face when there was soon no cold beer and then no beer!

All was soon forgotten as we listened to our first pre-dive briefing from Jonny and Steph. During the flight Roger had allocated the tasks of organising the dives to various pairs with everybody having something to do during the course of the week. This served both to reduce Roger's workload and more importantly make everybody appreciate the efforts and considerations that are needed to safely plan the diving. Everybody rose to the occasion and during the week we were treated to some excellent briefings from all age groups and experience levels. The size and experience level of the group frequently allowed us to have two diving teams. This allowed everyone the chance of undertaking some more challenging dives in a safe environment.

The first days diving at White Nights and Ras Bob gave us the chance to meet our dive guides for the week Naza and John and the crew of our home on the sea

'Sabele'. We all quickly settled into the routine of kitting up and buddy checking in readiness for the call *Dive, Dive, Dive!* These early check dives gave everybody the chance to check their weight and hone their SMB skills. It was a mighty impressive sight to see a forest of SMBs ascend from the deep at the end of dive one. Our team of snorkelers also got into the swing of things with the newer members following the lead of the old hands. Our boat monitor Mark Taylor had lost none of his enthusiasm from '07 always ensuring he was back on the boat ready to pounce as the divers were recovered.

Day two saw us make our first visit of the trip to Shark Reef and Yolanda (did Roger mention it was one of his favourites?). We were treated to the sight of a flight of Cuttle fish majestically cruising across our eye line, whilst others spotted their first Sea Turtle. The second dive of the day was a very pleasant tour in and around the wreck of the Dunraven, good preparation for those of us planning to dive the Thistlegorm later in the week. Day two also saw the first night dive of the trip at Ras Katy. An opportunity for some night dive virgins to break their duck and try their hand at the art of lion fish feeding.

Day three took us back to Shark reef and Yolanda and an opportunity to catch the things that we had missed on the day before and for some good depth progression for a number of us. The sea was calm enough for our snorkel team to be above us on the wreck of the Yolanda and be treated to the best outing of the trip. Then on to Raz Zatar and Ras Umm Sid for the remaining dives of the day. The sight of a pod of dolphins en route keeping everybody entertained.

Thistlegorm - Day four started at what seemed like day three as we boarded the boat at 3.45 am (yes AM). One member of the team was heard to exclaim that he 'didn't realise that there was a 4.30 in the morning!'. We were lucky enough to arrive on the wreck before most of the other dive boats which gave us the opportunity for a relatively quiet first dive. Roger's group deciding that the current was a little too much like hard work took cover inside the wreck and allowed the other group with the dive guide Naza to explore the outside of the vessel. Dive 2 for both groups allowed us to venture further into the wreck. The dives ticked many firsts for me as armed with our own fish expert Andy Wiles I discovered many new species of fish that I had not encountered before. Whilst Roger and I selflessly accompanied Mr Wiles on his 10 minute (how long!) deco stop we were lucky enough to be helped out by an unknown diver who wrestled Roger's tank into submission as it attempted to part company with his BCD. Observant as ever I thought that he was pointing out a shark - this was before the wrestling started. On our way back to port we stopped off at a new dive site for most of us Ras Gizrani for a third dive.

Our Entertainment Officer – Kate Gard had decided to forgo the opportunity to dive the Thistlegorm again deciding instead to stay back at the Creative Grand Sham to direct a film 'Dolphin Rescue' starring the two youngest members of the expedition team – Nicole and Stephanie Bray. For those that haven't seen it – it's a stunner! Having been bitten by the movie bug Kate decided along with Sue and Jo to have a mud wrap with the hope of coming out looking like a movie star – Cameron Diaz was mentioned, sadly Boris Karloff materialised... this movie filmed in secret by Simon MUST make YouTube.

Day five and for most of the team the last days diving saw us head out to Tiran Island to dive Jackson and Woodhouse reef. The first dive crossing from Jackson reef to

Woodhouse reef was simply stunning with an abundance of fish and a staggering array of brightly coloured corals. The second dive along Jackson reef saw us find some of the current that had been promised on a number of earlier dives which added a bit of excitement to the end of the dive. What we hadn't banked on were the tales of an Oceanic White Tip shark that had circled the boat just as our snorkel team climbed back aboard. Can you believe that the only people who didn't see it were the ones under the water who were scanning the blue for any kind of shark? (editors note: sightings of Bullsh*t sharks were ruled inadmissible earlier in the trip along with sightings of glasses in the hotel).

A few of us chose to take the opportunity to do a second night dive on the Temple and were treated to the site of a herring ball. Imagine the sight of literally thousands of fish that you can split with a torch beam in the darkness – awesome! Most of us took pity on a number of hungry looking lion fish to help them find their supper whilst Ruth tried to convert them to a diet of algae and seaweed. We finished an excellent dive with a healthy surface swim back to our boat.

Day six saw 12 of us decide to take the plunge a couple more times. An excellent dive on the Tower with masses of aquatic life and a very large moray was rounded off when Andy Wiles surfaced as a qualified Dive Leader. The second dive on the rather disappointing Amphora's Garden site saw Ruth also get signed off as a Dive Leader.

Back at the hotel more entertainment followed as a number of the group decided to have coffee wraps and more mud wraps – I confess having witnessed it I will stick to the diving! Later in the hotel restaurant there were cries of 'eet's a RAT Mr Fawly!' as a rather large brown rat ambled across the room. Like most of us it was probably only looking for a glass...

Luckily we were all going out to an Egyptian evening organised by Alistair and our dive guides. A good helping of traditional food and entertainment was a perfect way to round off the holiday

So day seven was upon us and time to force all of the gear back into the bags and head for home. We had all been treated to a number of fantastic dives (over 200 in total) and were definitely more experienced than when we had arrived. The hotel was certainly not 'as advertised' but that only added to the fun that the whole team had. This year's Christmas party will be filled with stories of mankinis, hooka pipes, glasses, mummies and I've no doubt the Bullsh*t shark!

Thanks to all of the team for making this a memorable holiday – full of good fun, excellent learning and of course great, safe diving. Ready for 2009 anybody?
